Literacy

To help develop listening, talking and comprehension skills the class will be working on the novel study, "The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark" by Jill Tomlinson.

They will also be developing their knowledge of VCOP to develop their sentence structure and build on the vocabulary used in their writing.

Numeracy and Maths

In numeracy, the children will be extending their knowledge of numbers up to 100 or 1000. They will be practising reading, writing and ordering large numbers and rounding to the nearest 10 or 100. They will be continuing to increase their speed and accuracy in their number bonds.

In Maths, the children will be working on Money using coins up to £2. We will also be looking at Venn diagrams.

Interdisciplinary Learning

.In connection with the novel study 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark', the children will be studying the topic of Light and Dark and will also investigate food chains and food webs. After our visit from the Ranger on the topic of owls, the class will be visiting Roslin Glen on 4th October to continue to learn about animal habitats and food chains of woodland animals.

R.M.E.-

R.M.E this term will look at celebrations associated with the Christian faith such as christenings, weddings and Christmas.

HWB

Our health and wellbeing this term will look at ways of keeping safe in familiar situations, such as the home, school and community. They will also learn why rules are important.

Homework

Maths and Spelling homework will be given out on a Monday to be completed by the Friday. Reading will be spread over the week with the pages to be read listed in their reading diary.

We would appreciate it if you could sign your child's homework when complete.
