Literacy & Language

Primary 5 will be reading "Rooftoppers" as a novel study this term and will be undertaking a range of literacy tasks based on this text. For writing we will be mostly focusing on personal pieces and report writing. Being able to ask and answer questions when listening to a variety of sources is also something we will be working on in a listening and talking context.

Numeracy & Maths

Primary 5 have kicked off our numeracy this term by learning how to identify, order and add and subtract integers. We will also be looking at the link between the multiplication and fractions, decimals, and percentages. Keep practising those times tables please! In Maths, we will be looking at chance and uncertainty, as well as using real contexts to analyse data.

Expressive Arts/Technologies

Primary 5 are learning a range of skills in art this term, where we will use a variety of techniques and media, drawing inspiration from our novel study and topic. Drama lessons will be linked with our novel study, where the children will be encouraged to explore imaginary situations from a character's point of view.
