<u>Literacy & Language</u>

Primary 5 have started 2017 exploring Scots language through poetry, songs and stories. In listening and talking we will be focussing on identifying key words and using these to create our own texts. In reading we are learning about characterisation and in writing we are working on improving plot development in our imaginative stories.

<u>Numeracy & Maths</u>

The main numeracy topics this term will be multiplication and division. Please encourage your child to practise all known times tables as much as possible, as instant recall is very important in your child's progress in many other numeracy concepts. In Maths, we will be looking at Data and Analysis, along with Symmetry and Transformation.
