Literacy

In listening and talking we will be discussing our favourite things and will work towards presenting these to the rest of the class.

Numeracy

We are coming to the end of our focus on subtraction in numeracy and will be moving on to looking at strategies we can use with multiplication and division.

This term after completing our focus on time in maths we will be working on shape and measure (length/weight).

RME

This term we will be learning about Hinduism and the gods Hindus believe in.

HWB

P3 will be learning more about good relationships. We have already begun to speak about our similarities and differences and will be looking more at this and how we can maintain positive relationships with others by caring and sharing.

Interdisciplinary learning
