Maths / Numeracy

Children have been working very hard and are showing an improved understanding of fractions both within shapes and numerically through problem solving.

We are continuing our focus of multiplication and will be adding depth to this through the introduction of division.

We will also be looking at Time and 2D and 3D Shape.

Social Studies

The children are really enjoying the Viking topic which will continue for a further number of weeks before culminating in a visit to the Museum.

We will also be looking at Autumn and Changing Materials before Christmas.

Literacy

We have been working on a novel study and have timetabled personal reading to encourage enjoyment of choice.

In writing we have been looking at Newspaper Articles and the class all wrote exciting reports about a Viking invasion! During this term we will develop our Imaginative Writing skills, as well as look at writing a variety of poetry linked to topic subjects.

We will be creating presentations within our Topic Work as part of Listening & Talking and the children are already looking forward to this.

The Primary 5 class have been working on fitness and will continue to develop this using different circuits.

Within Cool in School we have focussed on Cool Responses and we are now developing Cool Thinking. We are finding that this is encouraging children to work together and has created a very positive area ethos.
