<u>Literacy & Language</u>

This term we will continue developing our reading comprehension skills -making use of the school's new resources- while also focusing on summarising both written text and other media. We have made good progress in our story writing, and are about to self assess and edit our most recent work. We will then move onto diary writing, considering both a fictional perspective and historical examples.

<u>Numeracy & Maths</u>

Building on our fractions work, we have explored decimals and percentages, linking the four operations to practical problems of money and quantity. Next week both P6 classes will begin the exciting opportunity of working in partnership with teaching staff from Beeslack HS to help strengthen our numeracy skills, especially with future years in mind. Throughout the term we will also continue to reinforce our mental and written skills.

<u>Expressive Arts/</u> <u>Technologies</u>

P6A have enjoyed creating a variety of styles of art from the Victorian period, including Monet Houses of Parliament and Charles Rennie Mackintosh stained glass designs. We have also been successfully involved in a song writing project to create a unique track, which will be shared soon. In ICT the class have begun a course in Computer Science and programming based on the resource: code.org
