### A MESSAGE FROM MRS. BERRY

I am really proud of Primary 7 so far this session. We have been working very hard and children are coming to school each day prepared to learn and succeed. They have really enjoyed using their pupil profiles to track their numeracy work and use it as a place to hold work they are particularly proud of. Many of you had the chance to see these white folders at our parent consultation evenings.

A big focus this year is ensuring that Primary 7s have opportunities to show how responsible they are and develop their leadership skills. Our house captains are doing a fantastic job and the Junior Road Safety Officers led an excellent Walk to School Week. Our prefects do a wonderful job throughout the week making sure the P1s are keeping themselves safe and having fun. The Eco Committee members have been showing the infants how to separate the rubbish from their lunches into the appropriate bins and recycling containers. Pupil Council members will be busy this term with me as we help develop issues identified in the School Improvement Plan. Our lead technician in P7 is helping to train people to use the laptop and sound system at assemblies and singing time. We have a great team who also help set up the hall for these events. P7 have also really enjoyed the time they have had with their P1 buddies.

### **HWB**

Throughout this term we will be continuing our unit on relationships. So far we have discussed the issue of stereotypes and prejudice.
