Maths / Numeracy

We will also be looking at Data Handling and 2D and 3D Shape.

Social Studies

The children are really enjoying the Viking topic which will continue for a further number of weeks before culminating in a visit to the Museum.

We will also be looking at Autumn and Changing Materials before Christmas.

Literacy

We have been working on our novel study and have completed many related activities to help us develop our Reading skills and Understanding. We have also timetabled personal reading to encourage enjoyment of choice.

In writing we have worked hard to develop our imaginative writing, in particular writing in detail with lots of description. During this term we will develop our Instructional Writing and reinforce the areas we have already covered. We will also look at writing a variety of poetry linked to topic subjects.

We will be creating presentations within our Topic Work as part of Listening & Talking and the children are already looking forward to this.

The Primary 4 P.E. classes are working together in P.E. to promote social skills.

Within Cool in School we have focussed on Cool Responses and we are now developing Cool Thinking. We are finding that this is encouraging children to work together and has created a very positive area ethos.
