We have had another busy successful term at Roslin. We have just launched our "Oor Wullie bucket Trail" challenge. The 5 bucket trail



## Nursery Community Garden

We have received the Tesco Grant of £2000 and we are now in a position to start developing our nursery community garden and outdoor space.

Planning is underway and we are working with parents to create a space within the school grounds that will not only be educational but will also be good for wildlife and the environment.

Some of the things we are considering are; raised planters to grow our own vegetables, a designated wildlife area with adjacent seating, an outdoor snack area and native hedging planted around the perimeter of the garden.

We are also hoping to involve a number of local communities such as the Midlothian Community Service Payback Scheme, Roslin Mens Shed, The Rotary Club & The Midlothian Ranger Service.

We would like to thank everyone who has come forward to help us with this project.
