

	<p>This week we are going to be introducing the magic e spelling rule. You should practise reading these until you can read them fluently. How quickly can you read them?</p> <p>Extra Challenge: can you ask a grown up to read out the sentences for you to try and write down?</p> <p>Spicy Challenge Read the passage ‘The Maze’ saved on Teams. Underline (or point out) all the a_e words. Write three sentences to answer the three questions at the bottom. You can do this on paper instead of printing the sheet.</p> <p>Extra Hot Challenge Read the tricky passage ‘The Debate’ saved on Teams. Underline (or point out) all the a_e words and write sentences to answer the questions. *Please note this is a very challenging task for P2 level so only attempt if you feel you require this additional level of reading challenge.</p>	<p>Use the writing starter sheet on Teams (or copy the starter onto paper). - Can you create and answer quick fire subtraction questions?




Maths Board Game Challenge

	<p>This week we have a variety of tasks for you to try linked to our story.</p> <p>All the instructions are uploaded to our Teams page.</p> <p><u>Task 1: Listening and Talking</u> Play the 'Guess Who' game with an adult. Take it in turns to describe an animal from the sheet and see if your partner can guess the animal. Spicy Challenge – Choose some animals and write their description.</p> <p><u>Task 2: Alphabet Walk</u> When out on a walk see if you can see things that start with each letter of the alphabet. Spicy Challenge – Can you think of a describing word that starts with the same letter as the object e.g. tall trees. This is called <u>alliteration</u>!</p> <p><u>Task 3: Making Music</u> Follow the instructions to make your own shakers, Can you play along to your favourite tune?</p>	<p>Join Ann for her live French Friday YouTube video at 11am.
