Children's tracking

Early years pathway is a tool, we use for each individual child. The pathways have been developed by reflecting on national guidance including benchmarks and current research and assessment approaches from within and out with our local authority. We have complied 3 pathways Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Wellbeing which we feel reflects children's potential journey through early level but does not represent a fixed linear progression. This pathway will:

- Help practitioners identify where children are in their literacy development
- Allow practitioners to reflect on current learning and potential development
- Enable practitioners to moderate their professional opinions and judgments
- Support sharing of learning with parents and children
- Support all transitions within early level

Evidence of learning will come from a variety of sources including observations, conversations with parents and carers, learning conversations with children, reflection on learning journals, your own professional judgments, professional dialogue between staff and any other sources.

We use pathways to identify your child's next learning priority.

A copy of our pathways have been added to this newsletter for parents to become familiar with them.
