LEARNING AND TEACHING - Transition

As the children prepare to move onto their next classes it is important that we have a robust transition program in place. During the year progress is carefully tracked and time is set aside for this to be shared with the next teacher. Each class has a planning folder which contains a 'systems sheet', this is also part of the transition process as it contains key information about things such as allergies and diagnosis.

There will also be a meeting between Mrs Langdon, our support for learning teacher and class teachers to share strategies and supports.

CLASSES

The classes are still not organised for next session, we are awaiting a decision from Midlothian. We have planned 'Meet the Teacher' events for Thursday 15th June, the children should then come home that day with a letter sharing the class and teacher for next session.
